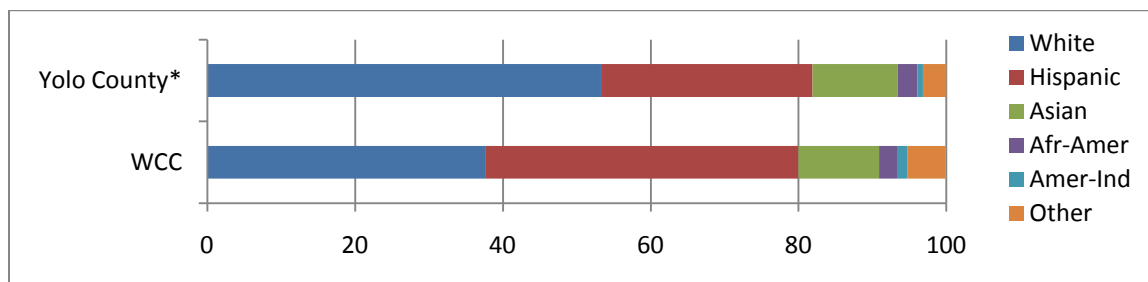


Woodland Community College 2008 Quick Facts

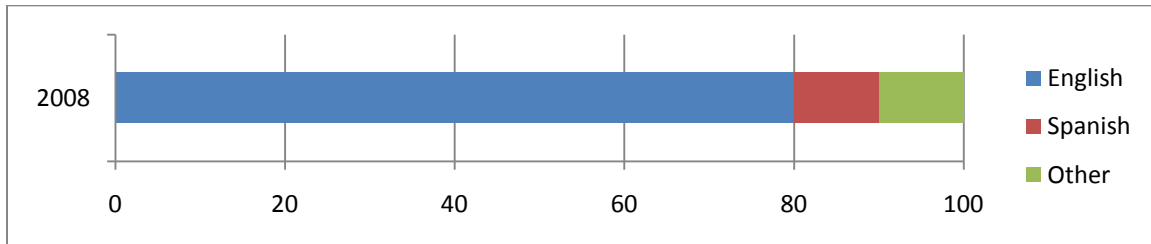
Ethnicity Distribution Comparisons Fall 2008



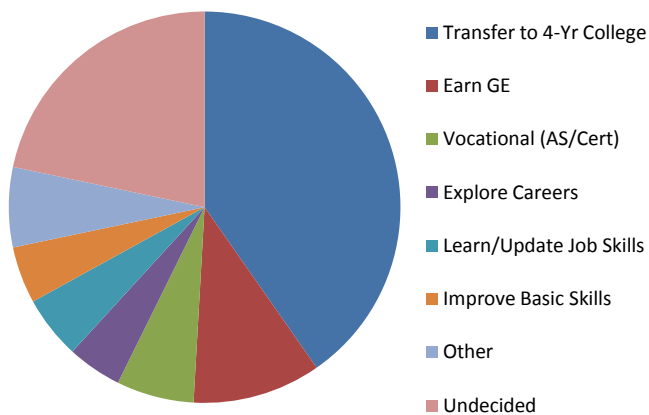

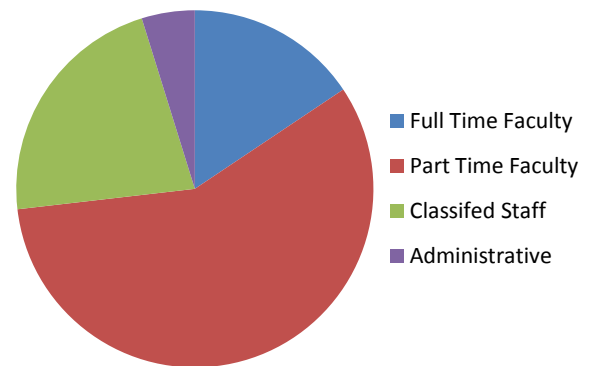
WCC Student Primary Language Fall 2008
